Science

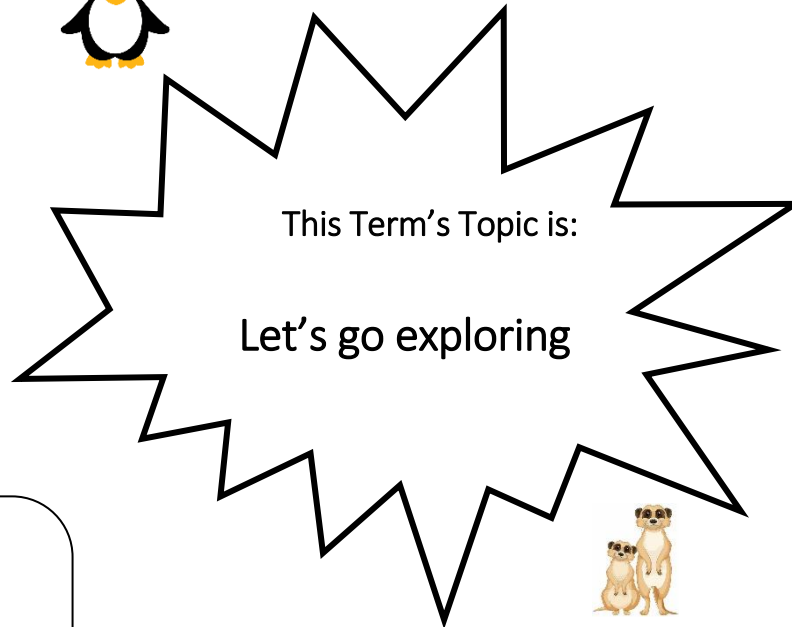
Animals including humans- parts of the body (1st half) and name and compare animals (2nd half)

- Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, including pets).

Mathematics

- Place value to 20- 2/3 weeks
- Addition and subtraction- 2 weeks
- Place value to 50- 2 weeks
- Length and height- 1 week
- Mass and volume- 1 week

Within these units, the children will have the opportunity to complete a range of problem solving and reasoning questions and activities.

Phonics

Every day the children will have a phonics session lasting for 20 minutes. These lessons follow the Little Wandle scheme of work.

Big Write

Every 2/3 weeks the children carry out an extended write.

Guided reading

Each child will receive three guided reading sessions a week. The first session will focus on decoding, the second prosody and the final lesson will focus on comprehension.

SPAG-

To write sentences including capital letters and full stops.

To write questions.

To extend sentences by adding 'and'.

Knowledge and understanding of the world

History

The Lives of significant individuals in the past who contributed to national and international achievements.

To learn about the achievements of Captain Robert Scott.

Geography

To compare the environments, habitats and animals of two contrasting climates.

-To know where Africa, the Artic, Antarctica and North and South Poles are on a world map. Also to draw links with distance from Haslingfield.

-To know the physical features of each location (beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, seas, soil, vegetation).

-To know the human features of each location (city, towns, port, harbour, farm etc).

-To know language related to basic directions (see year group "direction" skill progression)

-To compare weather patterns in the UK and a hot/cold location
