Information Booklets

Throughout the year we will be following No Nonsense Spelling for Years 3 and 4.

Big Write

Every 2/3 weeks the children carry out an extended write.

Guided reading

Each child will receive regular guided reading sessions a week where the focus will be on vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanations, retrieval and summarising.

Grammar and Punctuation

Children are taught these skills through the genres of writing that they are learning, Links are made to the genre to make it more connected with the intended writing outcomes.

For Year 3 this term, these skills will include: Conjunctions, adverbs and adjectives.

For Year 4 this term, these skills will include: Expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials.

Computing

<u>Autumn 1-</u> Computing Systems and Networks Collaborative Learning

- -Understand the need to be thoughtful when working collaboratively
- -Use comments to suggest changes to a document and understand how to resolve comments
- -Plan a survey for Microsoft Form with a range of different types of questions which will provide different types of answers (text, multiple choice, numerical etc) -Export data to a spreadsheet, highlighting date, using conditional formatting and calculating averages and sums of numbers

<u>Autumn 2</u>- Programming 1; Further Coding with Scratch

- -Understand how to create a simple script in Scratch
- -Add or change a sprite and prevent it from rotating
- -Use decomposition to identify key features and understand how to decipher actions that make the quiz game work
- -Understand what a variable is and how to use the 'say' and 'ask' blocks
- -Create a variable and be able to use a variable to record a score
- -Understand what a variable is and how it works within a programme

Physical Education

Autumn 1: Gymnastics: Canon and Unison

Pupils will explore movements and create sequences in both 'canon' and 'unison' for an end of unit performance.

Autumn 2: Dance: Weather

Children will be learning how to respond to different stimuli and add drama and emotion to the dance. We will be executing a wider variety of movements in extended sequences with a partner for performance.
